2) DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AND APPLICATIONS FOR DISPENSATION:

Cllr Mason-Hornby declared an interest in Agenda item 7 B4RN (Broadband for the Rural North)

3) MINUTES OF THE LAST PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD:

The previous minutes were approved and signed by the Chairman.

4) RECEIVE ANNOUNCEMENTS FROM CHAIRMAN

The Chairman explained the reason the August meeting date had changed.

- 5) OPEN FORUM
 - A resident of Morewood Drive was interested in Agenda item 7 B4RN and offered his support in forming a local community group to bring B4RN into Burton.
 - ii) A resident asked for an update on the possible funding for new local walk leaflets Councillors advised that this is now on the 'Outstanding Actions' and that some funding has been sourced.
- 6) Consider planning applications and formulate comments to the planning authority:

Applications received:

a) SL2017/0626 Westmorland View, Vicarage Lane, Burton-in-Kendal Conversion of domestic storage area to self-contained annexe for dependent adult.

Discussion took place and concerns were raised regarding parking at this property.

The Council voted not to object to this application (3 votes to 2)

b) SL2017/0688 Burton Morewood C of E Primary School Single Storey extension

1 letter of objection has been received with concerns for parking. Discussions took place and the Council have no objections to this planning application.

7) B4RN (Broadband for the Rural North)

Councillor Mason-Homby informed the Council that the fibre optic broadband network is going to be available for the whole of Burton. There will be a cabinet installed at Church Bank Development that will have enough capacity to service Burton. Councillor Mason-Hornby has now suggested that a spokesman from the group B4RN be invited to give a talk to the Parish Council and Parishioners with a view to setting up a community group to take this initiative forward.

8) PLAIN QUARRY

Councillor Hopwood read out a report from Councillor Haigh listing maintenance works required at Plain Quarry. It was agreed that some jobs could be done by Forest Enterprises and the other works would be done by Councillors and added to the 'Outstanding Actions' and updated monthly.

9) FINANCE

The Council received the Income and Expenditure and the bank reconciliation. This was checked and signed by Cllr Rogers.

Slape Lane and Boon Town Lane verges and hedges have been cut. The extra lamp post on Dalton Lane still has not been removed and requested the Clerk look into this.
